PADSAD, the unique school aiming to mainstream every Hearing Impairment & Divyang Student. PADSAD means ECHO, sound response. Hearing-impaired people are deprived of this sense & hence they cannot speak & become mute. PADSAD KARNABADHIR VIDYALAYA was established in July 1991 to identify Hearing impaired students' economically backward domain.

The festival of lights, Diwali, is arguably India's biggest religious celebration, when homes, institutions and entire neighbourhoods are decorated with lanterns, candles, earthen lamps and fairy lights on this auspicious moonless night. Diwali is a multiple-day festival that represents the triumph of good over evil, light over darkness. Diwali is one of the few Indian festivals that almost all people celebrate, regardless of their faith.

In this festival people set kandeels or lanterns afloat high, a gesture to invite the spirits of their ancestors moving around to come back home and be with them during the festival time; hence the name akasha deepa (lantern of the sky) or Akasha Kandeels.

In this Diwali, Prayas Youth Forum & Social Research Foundation organized a lantern-making workshop for dumb and deaf students coming from economically backward domain. The event was organized for students of Padsad Karnabadhir Vidyalaya
