1) Welcome to all members

Dr. K. N. Nandurkar welcomed Mr. Nilesh Salgaonkar, Dr Rajendra Sangle, Mr. Rohit Kulkarni and Management Representative Dr. V. M. Sewlikar.

2) Confirmation of Minutes of previous IQAC Meeting

Resolution: The copies of agenda, Minutes of Meeting of last IQAC meeting and relevant documents were circulated to all members. Prof. N. M. Shahane read out the minutes of last meeting. The minutes were confirmed and approved.

3) Review of IQAC activities (Mar. 2026 to May 2026)

Prof. N. M. Shahane presented review of IQAC activities conducted during **March 2026 to May 2026**. He has briefly reported the activities carried out in last three months.

4) Planning of IQAC Activities ((June 2026 to August 2026)

Prof. N. M. Shahane presented the planning of IQAC activities for the period **June 2026 to August 2026**.

5) Open discussions

Mr. Nilesh Salgaonkar explained that learnability, curiosity and attitude are important characteristics of a student.

Dr. Rajendra Sangle remarked that many students cannot ask questions because of fear factor. Mr. Salgaonkar added that he was going to offer a reward for most silly question asked! Mr. Salgaonkar remarked that keeping interactive sessions with answering raised questions is a good practice.

Dr. Preeti Bhamre presented the report of learnability workshop for slow and advanced learners and of training on AI Enabled Teaching. She informed that what different teachers are doing and so making them aware of many AI tools is essential. She added that in prompt engineering 5 main characteristics are needed to get more correct answers from prompt.

Dr. Rajendra Sangle asked about subscriptions, number of users and limitations of words in prompt. Dr. Preeti Bhamre informed that students are already started using prompt engineering from first year itself and they are not only use ChatGPT but use LAMA also. Student representative Mr. Vishwesh Pathak said that they were enjoying one-year free subscription. Dr. Sangle suggested to use corporate Email ID.

Dr. Preeti Bhamre presented feedback collected from students along with cumulative summary for last 3 years.

Mr. Salgaonkar asked that which parameters in feedback are focused.

Dr. Bhamre informed that lecture observation is conducted for faculty having overall feedback impact score below 7.

Mr. Salgaonkar suggested to find overall in which parameter the faculty members are lagging.

Prof. N. M. Shahane informed about the session conducted on Fourier, Laplace and Z-Transform and also added that how the concept of Time Invariance can be taught. Mr. Salgaonkar added that for design of Systems such insights are important.

In the discussion on Internships Mr. Salgaonkar pointed out that and policy document for next academic year is necessary. Dr. Preeti Bhamre informed that as a first time activity overall exposure is good. Mr. Nilesh Salgaonkar suggested to improve number of internships with stipend.

Mr. Rohit Kulkarni emphasized on structured feedback as it adds value. In skill development and other interactions industry angles is to be accommodated. For increase in intake formal statistic is to be studied to serve the purpose. He also enquired about placement statistics across different branches and Dr. K. N. Nandurkar nodded it and informed to add in subsequent meetings.

In the discussion on campus placement Mr. Rohit Kulkarni put the situation of the students. The students are not very much aware of expectations of industry from them and they are always puzzled about the criteria of selection and qualities required. It is expected that students should get such training in advance based on inputs received during campus selection. Dr. K. N. Nandurkar suggested to have recruiter's feedback after every selection process.

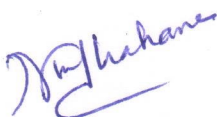
Mr. Rohit Kulkarni also shared his experiences with students that they miss Basic Arithmetic. The situation is pathetic that students can't answer even the questions based on 8th/ 9th grade mathematics. Mr. Salgaonkar told that they seem forgetting what they have learnt at schools. Prof. Shahane added the importance of reversal and recall in learning.
